DCMH Leasing project provides 7 housing units to homeless individuals diagnosed with and affected by chronic substance abuse with, in many cases, co-occuring severe mental illness. Individuals served by the project may be experiencing other disabling health conditions or developmental disabilities. The Guidance Center of Westchester, Inc (TGCW) is the sub-recipient operating the project on behalf of the Westchester County Department of Community Mental Health (DCMH). TGCW has extensive experience delivering quality housing, mental health, substance abuse and vocational services to people with mental health and substance abuse issues.

We will use a Housing First approach to offer eligible participants immediate access to permanent supportive housing.

Supportive services are delivered by TGCW's other programs as well as in partnership with Westchester County DCMH, and numerous other mental health, substance abuse, health, vocational, advocacy and school- and community-based programs throughout the county. These combined services facilitate success in each individual's recovery process.

Projected outcomes for this project are: (1) at least 86% of residents will have remained in permanent housing as of the end of the operating year or will have exited to permanent housing (subsidized or unsubsidized) during the operating year, and (2) at least 71% of residents age 18 and older will have maintained or increased their total income (from all sources) as of the end of the operating year or at program exit.

The project consists of studio and 1BR units. The project serves to secure and maintain permanent housing in apartment locations of the residents' choosing throughout Westchester County.
