NETWORK PRESENTATION GUIDE

Network is an innovative approach for families who need the support of a variety of service systems. The Network meeting is the start of a process that builds on the strengths and resources of the family and the community to develop individualized, collaborative systems of support for highly stressed children and their families.

Network is based on the belief that children are best served in their own homes, with supports in their own communities. Families have the best understanding of and ability to meet their children's needs; service providers are most effective when they view families as partners and colleagues.

WHAT HAPPENS AT A NETWORK MEETING?

- At the start of the Network meeting, the family will be asked to review the attendance sheet and sign a voluntary consent form for the meeting.
- The family will be asked to identify who is in the family, and who are their resources and supports.
- The meeting will include a discussion of the children's and family's strengths and capabilities, and a focus on the family's goals and concerns.
- The family and the Network participants will then discuss some options for resources and services to help the family reach their goals.
- The family, with the help of the Network participants, will identify the members
 of the coordinated team, called the "support circle", who will continue to meet to
 help the child and family work towards their goals. One or more of the team
 members will co-chair the support circle, along with the family. The support
 circle members will identify a time and place for the next meeting.

HOW DO I ARRANGE A NETWORK MEETING?

- Identify why you would like to invite this family to Network, and how you think Network might be helpful to the family.
- Tell the family about the Network process; stress that Network is strength-based and family-focused. Discuss possible Network participants and resource people with the family, and obtain consent to contact them. Let the family know that Network participants must follow the laws of confidentiality, and that information can be shared only with the family's consent.
- Discuss the family with a Network chairperson, to establish that it is appropriate for Network and to set a meeting date. The Network chairperson may also help you identify resource people to invite to Network.
- Ask the family's permission to have Family Ties, a family support organization for families of children with emotional problems, contact them before the Network.
 Family Ties can be significant in helping families feel prepared for Network.
